Contact a school principal and request permission to talk to a teacher who might like to help you start a Youth Garden Club. Science teachers are already doing most of the work that would interest a Youth Garden Club. Find a good one and you have the beginning of a whole new experience. Presenting butterfly gardening or Louisiana native plant programs are both interesting and easy ways to work within a school system.

- Consult a church concerning the use of their facilities as a source of membership and a meeting place.
- Neighborhood children love to form clubs. Try a Summer Club or a Saturday Club. Why not a “Grandchildren Club” – remember only **five** members are needed.
- Work with already established groups such as 4-H, Scouts, and community recreation centers. **They can also be a Garden Club.**
